## A NEIGHBORHOOD GREENWAY IS COMING TO YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD!

The following street improvements will begin as soon as mid-September 2023:

- Repair cracked pavement (crack seal and asphalt patching)
- Install speed humps/ cushions on NE 82nd St between Roosevelt Way NE & Lake City Way NE and 14th Ave NE between NE 82nd St & NE 85th St
- Replace concrete panels on NE 82nd St between 14th Ave NE & 15th Ave NE
- Sidewalk repair
- Install signs and markings for wayfinding

We are excited to announce that we are **starting construction on the Maple Leaf Neighborhood Greenway on NE 82nd St as soon as September 2023!** We will be installing the Neighborhood Greenway in stages, starting this fall and finishing in 2024.

When construction is set to begin, “no parking” signs will be placed along this street in certain locations. **Please move your vehicles during the “no parking” timeframes, otherwise it will be towed.**

# Overview

This section of NE 82nd St & 14th Ave NE has been identified as a key component to the larger neighborhood greenway network, which will provide future connections to neighboring communities and schools. The Maple Leaf Neighborhood Greenway will provide a safe and pleasant environment for people who walk and bike in their neighborhood, to and from Maple Leaf Reservoir Park, and other community destinations.

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION:

Typical construction hours are weekdays, 7 AM to 5 PM, with occasional weekend and night work. Other expected construction effects may include:

- Temporary driveway impacts
- Noise and vibration
- Dust and debris
- Construction staging and parking impacts near the work sites
- “No Parking” areas and other parking impacts
- Crosswalk and sidewalk closures, and detours for people walking and biking
- Roadway closures and detours for vehicle traffic
- Changes in construction schedule due to unforeseen circumstances (i.e., weather, soil conditions, etc.)

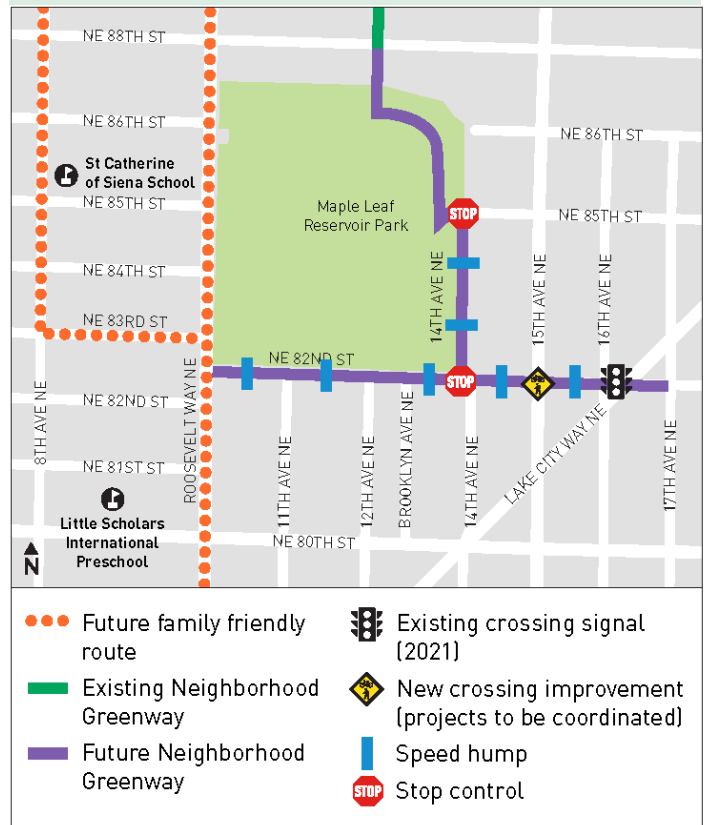

## WHAT IS A NEIGHBORHOOD GREENWAY?

Neighborhood greenways are safer, calmer residential streets for you, your family, and neighbors. We make people walking and biking the priority. The Maple Leaf Neighborhood Greenway will include:

- Speed humps/cushions to calm traffic
- Stop signs for side streets crossing the neighborhood greenway
- 20 mph speed limit signs
- Signs and pavement markings to help people find their way
