

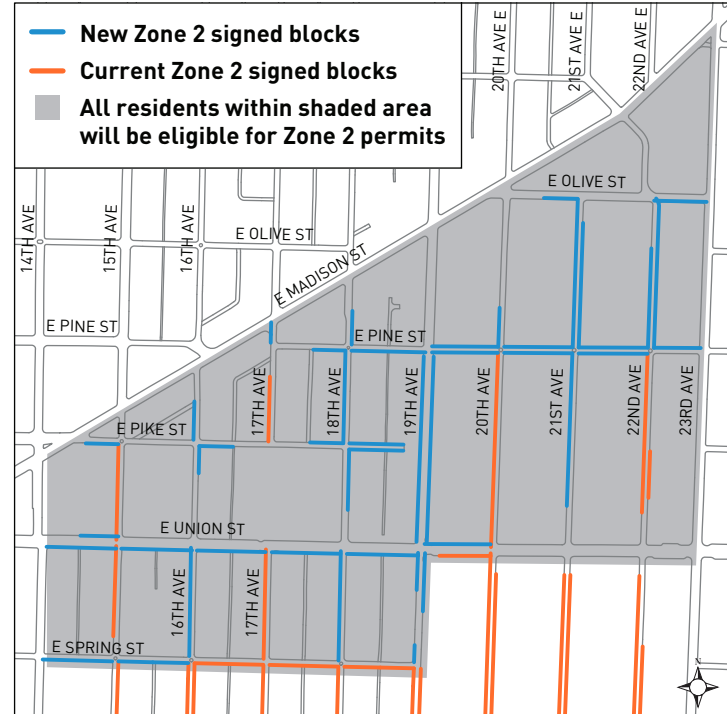
RESTRICTED PARKING ZONE (RPZ)

Notice of Decision

In response to neighborhood requests, the Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) investigated the possible expansion of Restricted Parking Zone (RPZ) 2. A proposed plan was shared with the neighborhood in January 2016. A public hearing on the proposed plan was held on February 9, 2016.

SDOT has considered public input and will install Zone 2 signs on the blocks identified in blue in late July 2016.

- All residents within the gray area will be eligible for Zone 2 permits
- Permits for residences north of and including E Union St are currently \$65 per vehicle for a two-year cycle
- Permits for residences south of E Union St are fully subsidized by Swedish Cherry Hill Hospital and Seattle University
- Zone 2 signs limit parking for vehicles without Zone 2 permits to 2 hours, Monday – Saturday, 7 AM – 6PM
- Zone 2 signs will not be installed adjacent to commercial properties or ground floor retail

RESTRICTED PARKING ZONE (RPZ) Notice of Decision

The Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) is issuing a decision regarding the expansion of Restricted Parking Zone 2. The map on the other side of this postcard highlights the area being added. All residents within the gray shaded area will be eligible for Zone 2 permits. Zone 2 signs will be installed on the blue lined blocks in late July 2016.
