# Construction Planned for 2020!

### Construction Updates

Construction is anticipated to begin as early as Summer 2020 and be completed by Fall 2022. As each phase of construction approaches, we will provide advance notice through a variety of ways including text messages, email updates, and detour signs. If you would like a project team member to speak with you about construction, please give us a call or send us an email.

### Anticipated Construction Upgrades

- Repaving the street
- Building new bus platforms in the roadway
- Placing new bus shelters and other station amenities
- Relocating overhead power lines as needed
- Undergrounding some utilities
- Installing new traffic signals
- Putting in new drainage
- Re-channelizing the street in some locations
- Building new, or upgrading existing, curb ramps
- Landscaping and final construction activities

### What to Expect During Construction

- Noise, dust, and vibration
- Potential nighttime and weekend work
- Pedestrian detours
- Temporary utility shut offs
- Transit impacts such as delays, detours, and temporary stop relocations
- Temporary driveway and road closures

### Proposed construction timeline

- Spring 2020: Contractor is selected to build the project.
  - After a contractor is selected, we will be able to determine the following:
    - Work schedule and working days
    - Construction sequencing
    - Traffic control plans (e.g. intersection closures and detours)
- Summer 2020: Construction is anticipated to begin in phases
- Fall 2022: Construction is done and bus service scheduled to begin

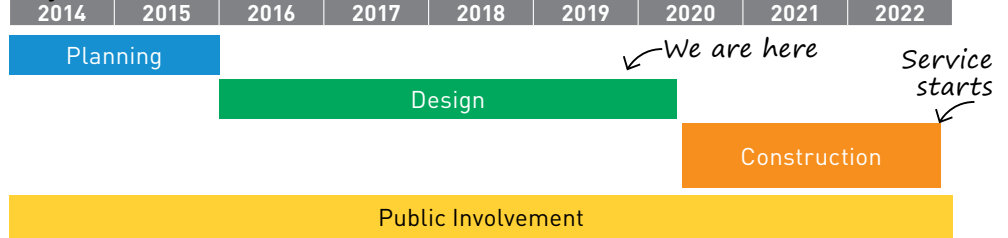

**Project Schedule**



**Project Overview**

The Madison St corridor is busy, dense, and still growing. Bus rapid transit (BRT) will provide frequent, reliable, and safe bus service. The Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) will make street improvements to the Madison St corridor that will allow King County Metro to operate the service as RapidRide G Line from Downtown to Madison Valley. Madison St BRT – RapidRide G Line will use diesel-hybrid buses, removing the need to expand or use the existing trolley wire on the corridor.

**Project Benefits**

Our Madison St BRT – RapidRide G Line design includes:

- Improved transit travel time by up to 5 minutes in the eastbound direction and up to 10 minutes in the westbound direction
- Increased ridership, serving over 12,000 riders per day
- Station platforms are accessible and level with the bus for quick and easy boarding
- Buses will have doors on both sides, allowing riders to board from new center-running stations (between 9th Ave and 13th Ave)
- New traffic signals so buses get to travel through intersections before other vehicles
- New art and landscaping for community placemaking
- New paving for a smoother ride and longer-lasting streets
- New bike facilities to connect to the existing bike network
- Improved sidewalk and crosswalk connections so pedestrians can get around the neighborhood and to their bus as safely and conveniently as possible

**Project Budget and Funding**

This project is partially funded by the voter-approved Levy to Move Seattle, the voter-approved Sound Transit 3 (ST3) package, and state and federal grants. We are pursuing Federal Transit Administration funding to be able to deliver this project. The project budget is \$121 million.
